San Fernando City Administrator Resigns Post *Pulido's Last Day is October 23*

City Administrator Jose Pulido announced his resignation today, citing a need to pursue new career opportunities.

Pulido will leave his post October 23 after an eight-year tenure.

"I would like to thank the City Council for providing me with the rare opportunity and privilege of serving my hometown, my community," said Pulido. "I'm extremely proud of what our management team has accomplished by putting the needs of San Fernando first."

Among his legacy, Pulido and the City's award-winning management team captured nearly \$36 million in competitive grants, leveraged over \$300 million in new and planned investment, developed a \$14.5 million world class aquatics facility, achieved the lowest crime rate in over 20 years, and turned the City's nearly bankrupt status into one with a solid A+ bond rating – the first such rating for the City.

"I am confident that the City Council will continue to move San Fernando forward and truly hope they can maintain the high bar of accomplishments previously set by its management team," said Pulido.

Pulido's departure marks the fourth resignation of the City's management team over the past six months.

The Council will meet to consider options for an interim City Administrator.
