PUBLIC STATEMENTS – WRITTEN/ORAL

Deputy City Clerk Ferrel introduced the new City Clerk Department Intern Cynthia Alba.

Ms. Alba introduced herself and stated that she is a resident of San Fernando and has two degrees in political science and communication, is excited about the changes made by the Education Commission, and shared ideas for promoting scholarships on social media.

Commissioner Robledo announced that she invited Principal Elizabeth Beltran, Cesar E. Chavez Learning Academies-Teacher Preparation Academy, to attend the meeting and asked to possibly re-open public statements when she arrives.

COMMISSION MATTERS

1) INTRODUCTION OF ASSEMBLYMEMBER LUZ RIVAS (ASSEMBLY DISTRICT 39)

Assemblymember Rivas said she was excited that she was invited, introduced Field Representative Arturo Garcia Mendoza, asked the Education Commission to provide ideas for events/campaigns for further partnerships, and said she wants to make sure the City has access to resources.

Discussion ensued, and Assemblymember Rivas replied to various questions from Commissioners. No formal action was taken.

2) PRESENTATION BY COMMUNITY SCHOOLS DIRECTOR LYNA ABAL (LOS ANGELES EDUCATIONAL PARTNERSHIP / SAN FERNANDO MIDDLE SCHOOL)

Chair Govea corrected the names to read Lyna Abal the Community School Coordinator with Los Angeles Education Partnership (LAEP) and Lisset Lazo the Program Manager for Best Start Communities.

Lyna Abal and Lisset Lazo provided information about LAEP, a nonprofit organization that works with schools and communities, whose focus is problem solving strategies. The organization's goal is to break down barriers in learning by supporting mental wellness and school renovations, and providing childcare services.

No formal action was taken.

3) DISCUSSION REGARDING SAN FERNANDO STUDENT OF THE MONTH NOMINATION, SELECTION AND PRESENTATION PROCEDURES

Chair Govea distributed a draft copy of the procedures and gave a brief update regarding Student of the Month applications that are expected go out mid-October.

Commissioner Robledo offered to draft a letter reaching out to local businesses for donations to be given away as a gift to the selected Student of the Month.

Discussion ensued regarding categories, nomination, selection, and the presentation at the City Council meeting. By consensus, Commissioners agreed to hold a special meeting on October 23.

Chair Govea introduced the Why Not You Scholarship application questions. A brief discussion ensued and, by consensus, Commissioners agreed to finalize the application by their next meeting.

Vice Chair Zobel-Rodriguez reminded all about reaching out to Councilmembers for scholarship donations and confirmed that Councilmember Fajardo offered to contribute \$250 from his discretionary funds.
