RECOMMENDATION:

BACKGROUND:

For each City Council meeting the Finance Department prepares a Warrant Register for Council approval. The Register includes all recommended payments for the City. Checks, other than special checks, generally are not released until after the Council approves the Register. The exceptions are for early releases to avoid penalties and interest, excessive delays and in all other circumstances favorable to the City to do so. Special checks are those payments required to be issued between Council meetings such as insurance premiums and tax deposits. Staff reviews requests for expenditures for budgetary approval and then prepares a Warrant Register for Council approval and or ratification. Items such as payroll withholding tax deposits do not require budget approval.

The Director of Finance hereby certifies that all requests for expenditures have been signed by the department head, or designee, receiving the merchandise or services thereby stating that the items or services have been received and that the resulting expenditure is appropriate. The Director of Finance hereby certifies that each warrant has been reviewed for completeness and that sufficient funds are available for payment of the warrant register.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the City Council:

- a. Accept the donation of four travel trailers from the State of California Department of General Services;
- Authorize the City Manager to execute the certificates of title, and related documents to transfer ownership of four travel trailers from State of California Department of General Services to the City of San Fernando.

BACKGROUND:

- 1. On March 4, 2020, California Governor Gavin Newsom declared a State of Emergency shortly after the State's first death was reported. The County of Los Angeles also declared a local emergency on March 4, 2020.
- 2. On March 11, 2020, the World Health Organization (WHO) declared the virus outbreak a pandemic.
- 3. On March 16, 2020, Supervisor Kathryn Barger announced an Executive Order mandating all bars, clubs, theaters, entertainment centers, and fitness centers in all cities and unincorporated areas in the County of Los Angeles are ordered to be closed until further notice.
- 4. On March 16, 2020, the City of San Fernando declared a local emergency due to public health threat caused by COVID-19.

Consideration to Accept the Donation of Four Travel Trailers from the State of California Department of General Services

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- 5. On March 19, 2020, the County of Los Angeles Disaster Management Area Coordinator (DMAC) contacted the City's Emergency Coordinator with information that travel trailers were being made available from the State through the County Operational Area (County Office of Emergency Management) for use for sheltering of City employees requiring isolation or quarantine due COVID-19 exposure.
- 6. On March 17, 2020, the City Manager, in his capacity as Director of Emergency Services, authorized the Police Department to request four trailers.
- 7. On April 4 5, 2020, four travel trailers were delivered and placed in Lot 6N.
- 8. On April 15, the City Manager issued Administration Policy No. ADM-4-01-2020 titled, "Emergency Non-congregate Sheltering Travel Trailer Usage" (Attachment "A"), which was amended on May 14, 2020.
- 9. In May 2020, the City was informed by DMAC the ownership of the four travel trailers would be transferred at no cost to the City.
- 10. In June 2020, the City received four Certificates of Title (Attachment "B") transferring ownership of each travel trailer to the City for execution and final processing by the California Department of Motor Vehicles.

ANALYSIS:

The purpose of the trailers is to support the City's continuity of COVID-19 response efforts by offering non-congregate sheltering to Essential Infrastructure staff that may be impacted by COVID-19. The trailers will continue to be located in Parking Lot 6N throughout the duration of the City's COVID-19 response efforts.

Three of the travel trailers provided to the City are model year 2020 and one is model year 2018. All trailers are in new or excellent condition and contain the basic amenities to provide a safe shelter for habitation. The trailers contain amenities such as linens, toiletries, and other equipment necessary to make the trailer suitable for sheltering such as power cords, leveling blocks, sewer connection hose, and water hoses.

Pursuant to the Administrative Policy, these trailers have been made available for City employees and their families for sheltering in the event of employees or family members needing to isolate or quarantine due to COVID-19 exposure. The trailers will continue to remain ready for the purpose of employee isolation and quarantine sheltering for the duration of the City's COVID-19 response efforts. Once the COVID-19 response concludes, staff will evaluate alternate uses for the trailers at that time.

Consideration to Accept the Donation of Four Travel Trailers from the State of California Department of General Services

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BUDGET IMPACT:

DMAC and Emergency County officials have assured the City that the travel trailers are being donated at no cost to the City with assurance that the City will not be responsible for any future financial reimbursement to the County or State's COVID-19 Emergency Programs. Finance staff will determine a current value for each trailer and will record them to the City's capital assets for the 2019 – 2020 Fiscal Year.

The total estimated value for all four travel trailers is \$133,821. Estimated value of the assets are listed below:

- 1. Cruiser, Shadow Cruiser, ID240 BHS, 2018 Chassis Number: 5RXDB2727JN358731 Suggested List Price: \$32,369
- 2. Heartland, Mallard, IDM260, 2020 Chassis Number: 5SFNB3127LN426693 Suggested List Price: \$32,942
- 3. Forest River, EVO, T2160, 2020 Chassis Number: 4X4TSJX29LC021284 Suggested List Price: \$33,388
- 4. Forest River, EVO, T2360, 2020 Chassis Number: 4X4TSJZ22LC021303 Suggested List Price: \$35,122

CONCLUSION:

Staff recommends that the City Council accept the donation of the four trailers and authorize the City Manager to execute the transfer of ownership of the Certificates of Title, and all related documents.

MANAGEMENT POLICY/PROCEDURES

SECTION I. BACKGROUND

The City of San Fernando has secured four travel trailers ("Trailers") through the Los Angeles County Emergency Operations Center (CEOC) to be used as emergency Non-Congregational Sheltering (NCS). The Trailers are funded by the California Office of Emergency Services (CAL OES) and designated for use by City employees that are required to self-isolate, self-quarantine, or otherwise avoid physical interaction as a result of a suspected or confirmed exposure to the novel coronavirus (COVID-19).

SECTION II. PURPOSE

The purpose of this Policy is to determine eligibility to use the Trailers for NCS to support City staff members' efforts to slow the spread of COVID-19 and provide necessary treatment to those that are, or may be, infected with COVID-19.

SECTION III. CRITERIA

The criteria below are meant to define circumstances under which City employees are required to quarantine or isolate. Employees that meet the criteria are eligible to use the Trailers for temporary sheltering. Eligibility does not guarantee use of the Trailers. Use of the Trailers is subject to availability and approval by the City Manager and Chief of Police.

The criteria is intended to be in-line with the Los Angeles County DPH definitions for quarantine and isolation.

Quarantine:

Quarantine separates and restricts the movement of people who have been exposed to a contagious disease to see if they become sick. Any employee exposed to a person diagnosed with or likely to have COVD-19, as determined by the Los Angeles County DPH, Los Angeles Fire Department, San Fernando City Manager, San Fernando Police Chief, licensed healthcare professional, or other government agency, must adhere to the following requirements:

• Separate themselves from other people and restrict the movement, preferably at home, for 14 calendar days from last time the person had contact with a person experiencing symptoms.



- Stay in the place of quarantine for all 14 days, except to receive medical care.
- Monitor symptoms daily and immediately report the onset of symptoms to their healthcare provider and supervisor.
- If the employee develops symptoms, even mild symptoms, they must isolate immediately pursuant to the criteria below.

Isolation:

Isolation separates sick people infected with a contagious disease from people who are not sick. Any employee diagnosed (through a positive test or determination by a licensed healthcare provider) with, or showing symptoms consistent with the disease within 14 days of being in close contact with a person who has been diagnosed, or presumed to be infected, with COVID-19 must adhere to the following requirements:

- Completely separate themselves from other people and restrict all movement, except to receive medical care, for at least 7 days from the onset of symptoms and for 3 days after last experiencing symptoms (e.g. being fever free without taking medicine).
- Immediately notify any person with whom the employee had close contact with while symptomatic so they that person can self-quarantine.

SECTION IV. PROCEDURE

Use of the Trailers are reserved for <u>City Employees</u> that meet the eligibility criteria pursuant to Section III. Also, the use of the Trailers maybe used by City Employees with family members that meet eligibility criteria, on a case by case basis, and approved by the City Manager and Chief of Police. Once the request has been received and approved, the use of the Trailers are subject to availability. Visitors or guests ARE NOT allowed in the Trailer.

Once the employee is determined to be eligible by a healthcare professional and receives approval to use the Trailer, the employee is responsible for the following:

- Contact the City's designated medical provider or Company Nurse each day to receive medical consultation and monitor development of the employee's symptoms.
- Self-check temperature twice per day (i.e. in the morning and in the afternoon) and provide the results via email to the City's Emergency Coordinator to be maintained in a spreadsheet for monitoring.
- Maintain cleanliness by placing used linens in a plastic sealed bag on the steps of each trailer by 0900 hours (9:00 am) each day.
- Providing clothing, personal hygiene supplies, required medications, reading and entertainment materials, mobile phone with working cellular service, snacks (other than breakfast, lunch, dinner and drinking water), and any other personal items that are required for the duration of the employees isolation/quarantine.

The City is responsible for providing the following utilities and services:

- Provide clean linens each day (1 set of sheets and 2 towels). The City will collect the used linens placed on the steps of the trailer by the occupant each day. Linens and towels must be placed by 0900 hours (9:00am) each day in a red biomedical bag provided by the City. Staff will take them to the jail biomedical container for pick up by the Linen supplier.
- Food will be delivered from a local restaurant for breakfast, lunch and dinner through. The cost for each meal will be consistent with the per diem meal rate established in the City's Travel Expense Reimbursement Policy. Any dietary restrictions will need to be established at time of approval for use of the Trailer.
- The City will provide personal laundry services (i.e. personal clothing) through a local laundromat or cleaning services. Personal laundry will be picked up and delivered to the Trailer. The employee shall notify the Emergency Coordinator when these services are required.
- Electricity will be provided by City through a generator or direct electrical connection with the proper capacity. The electrical connection will be monitored by Public Works staff.
- Water will be provided by the City through the Trailer's water tanks or direct water connection, if available. If the Trailer is not directly connected to a water source, Public Works staff will monitor the water level each day and refill the water tank as needed.
- Wastewater services will be provided by the City through a properly licensed contractor. Public Works staff will monitor the wastewater level each day and arrange for wastewater services as needed. Wastewater tanks will be emptied prior to refilling the water tanks to avoid an overflow of wastewater tanks.
- Propane gas, typically used to heat water, operate the stove and refrigerator, and heat the interior of the Trailer, will be provided by the City. Public Works staff will monitor the propane level and refill the tanks as needed.

City is responsible for providing the following supplies:


- Toilet tank refresher pods, which occupants must replace after each dump of the tank.
- RV toilet paper.
- Paper towels and tissue (WHICH MUST BE DISPOSED OF IN BIOMEDICAL BAGS SEPARATE FROM LINENS AND PICKED DAILY BY CLEANING SERVICES). THESE CANNOT BE DISPOSED OF IN TOILET. Signs will be placed over each toilet as a reminder.
- Paper goods and utensils (forks, knives, spoons, paper plates, napkins and cups).
- A coffee pot and coffee along with filters if requested by occupant prior to occupancy.

- Wash soap and hand sanitizer.
- Two cases of water.
- Disinfectant wipes and disinfectant spray cleaner.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the City Council:

- a. Approve the Public Safety Power Shutoff Community Resource Center License Agreement (Attachment "A" – Contract No. 1957) with Southern California Edison for use of Las Palmas Park and Recreation Park facilities; and
- b. Authorize the City Manager to make non-substances changes and execute all related documents.

BACKGROUND:

- On February 7, 2020, Southern California Edison (SCE) released their 2020-2022 Wildfire Mitigation Plan (WMP). The plan calls for proactive measures for lessening the impact of wildfires. The de-energization of transmission lines or a Public Safety Power Shutoff (PSPS) event and the development of Community Resource Centers (CRCs) are aspects of Edison's Wildfire Mitigation Plan.
- 2. On March 25, 2020, Southern California Edison contacted the Recreation and Community Services (RCS) Department to discuss the possibility of using Las Palmas Park and Recreation Park as CRC sites in connection with a PSPS event.
- 3. On April 9, 2020, RCS staff, Edison, and the City Attorney entered into discussions regarding a proposed license agreement for use of City facilities as Edison's CRCs. The City Attorney reviewed the terms and conditions of the proposed agreement and made revisions to the agreement to limit the City's liability.

4. On June 17, 2020, Southern California Edison agreed to the revised terms and conditions proposed by the City Attorney and expressed interest in entering into an agreement with the City for use of Las Palmas Park and Recreation Park as CRCs in connection with a PSPS event.

ANALYSIS:

The widespread destruction of wildfires is a major threat to public safety, health, and the economic stability of California. Since 2017, six catastrophic fires have burned millions of acres, claimed hundreds of lives, and billions have been spent on recovery. The goal of SCE's Wildfire Mitigation Plan (WMP) is to reduce the risk of potential wildfires associated with its electrical infrastructure in High Fire Risk Areas (HFRA). The 2020-2022 WMP sets in motion a comprehensive plan to harden the electrical system, provide situational awareness, and implement operational practices.

Key to the operational objectives of the WMP is to remove the threat of a wildfire by shutting off an electrical circuit and de-energize the transmission lines. This action, known as a Public Safety Power Shutoff (PSPS) event, gets triggered when weather modeling and forecasting predict severe weather in a HFRA and a probability of fire ignition is present. Consequently, when a PSPS event occurs, the impacted community may need a place to gather until the PSPS event is over.

SCE is actively pursuing customer care initiatives to help decrease the impact of PSPS events on affected communities. Examples of these initiatives include the deployment of Community Crew Vehicles (CCVs), activation of Community Resource Centers (CRCs), and engagement with impacted communities to help bolster preparedness. These CRCs are located both outside the HFRA (urban) and within the HFRA (remote), with the main difference being that the urban sites will not be impacted by the de-energized circuit, while the remote CRC would be impacted and rely on site resiliency, such as backup generation capability. The proposed agreement with the City will establish an urban CRC at both Las Palmas Park and Recreation Park.

SCE will provide a minimum 36-hour notification to use the parks as CRCs. The operational period of a CRC will be from 8:00 am until 10:00 pm and may be active up to five (5) consecutive days per PSPS event. The maximum capacity of a CRC site will be 40 people. RCS staff will set up and break down the CRC and SCE staff will be responsible for all other materials and equipment needed to operate the CRCs. RCS staff has identified space/rooms at each site that can function as a CRC site with minimum impact on the Department's programming. For each day use, SCE will compensate the City a fixed fee of \$1,500 per PSPS event.

BUDGET IMPACT:

The SCE compensation of \$1,500 per PSPS event is sufficient to offset the rental fees and staff time necessary to host a CRC. Therefore, approval of the License Agreement between SCE and the City will not affect the General Fund.

CONCLUSION:

It is recommended that City Council authorize the City Manager to execute the Public Safety Power Shutoff Community Resource Center License Agreement with Southern California Edison for use of Las Palmas Park and Recreation Park facilities.

PUBLIC SAFETY POWER SHUTOFF COMMUNITY RESOURCE CENTER LICENSE AGREEMENT

Between

SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA EDISON COMPANY

And

CITY OF SAN FERNANDO

This License Agreement, together with the exhibits attached hereto (as amended, restated, extended, renewed, modified, or supplemented from time to time, collectively, the "<u>Agreement</u>" is made and entered into as of this 6th day of July, 2020 (the "<u>Effective Date</u>") by SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA EDISON, A California corporation ("<u>SCE</u>") and CITY OF SAN FERNANDO, a California municipal corporation, ("<u>Licensor</u>"). SCE and Licensor are sometimes referred to herein individually as a "**Party**" and jointly as the "**Parties**".

RECITALS:

- A. Licensor owns or leases certain real property in the State of California and is willing to offer this real property and services for SCE's use as a customer resource center in connection with Public Safety Power Shutoff Events ("**PSPS Events**") as defined in Section 3 below, pursuant to the terms and conditions set forth in this Agreement.
- B. SCE is willing to secure space and services from Licensor to use as a customer resource center in connection with PSPS Events pursuant to the terms and conditions set forth in this Agreement.
- C. The Parties desire to memorialize this mutual understanding and agreement for making certain of the availability of Licensor's dedicated space and services to SCE in connection with PSPS Events.

NOW, THEREFORE, for good and valuable consideration, the Parties agree as follows:

- 1. <u>License Area</u>. The dedicated space that is the subject of this Agreement is located at:
 - a. 208 Park Avenue, San Fernando, California 91340; and
 - b. 505 South Huntington Street, San Fernando, California 91340
- 2. <u>Grant of License</u>. Subject to the terms and conditions set forth in this Agreement, Licensor grants SCE, SCE's Representatives, and SCE's customers, the right to use the License Area as a customer resource center in connection with a PSPS Event, provided such License Area has regular power service at the time of the PSPS Event, together with rights of ingress and egress to and from the License Area.
- 3. <u>Use.</u> The License Area shall be available every day from 8:00 AM to 10:00 PM for up to five (5) consecutive days per PSPS Event. The days (including any partial days) during which any of SCE's Activities are occurring in or on the License Area are referred to herein as ("<u>Use Days</u>.") During Use Days, SCE shall have Licensor's permission to use the License Area during the time period specified in this Section 3. SCE and its employees, contractors, agents, and representatives ("<u>SCE's Representatives</u>") may enter the License Area for purposes of establishing and operating a customer resource center in the case of a PSPS Event, (<u>"PSPS Activities</u>"). Licensor acknowledges that PSPS Activities may include the following: setting up signage, providing a smart phone charging kiosk, providing water and snacks, as well as providing up-to-date information on outages to customers; and staging of equipment, supplies and materials. For purposes of this Agreement, a ("<u>PSPS Event</u>") means the existence of one or more environmental

conditions creating extreme fire danger that results in the shutoff of power for public safety. Examples of PSPS Events include but are not limited to red flag warnings issued by the United States National Weather Service, low humidity levels, high winds, and dry vegetation.

- 4. <u>Event Notification</u>. SCE shall give Licensor a minimum of 36 hours prior notice of the date and time that SCE needs to access and use the License Area to the contacts identified by Licensor in Exhibit A. Licensor must respond to SCE's notice and confirm availability for access and use by SCE no later than 4 hours after receipt of SCE's notice of a PSPS Event.
- 5. <u>Term.</u> This License Agreement shall be for a term of five (5) years, commencing on July 6, 2020, and expiring June 30, 2025. Either Party may terminate the Agreement on Notice, which will be effective five (5) days after such Notice is given provided the terminating Party gives at least thirty (30) days' written Notice of the termination to the other Party.
- 6. <u>License Fee.</u> Upon the end of each month, Licensor shall send an electronic copy of the invoice to the SCE Contract Representative identified in Exhibit A for the payment of the License Fee. SCE shall, within forty-five (45) days of Licensor's invoice to SCE, pay Licensor a fixed fee of One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00) per Use Day per PSPS Event. If Licensor is not able to make License Area available for SCE's use during any portion of the time period or hours specified in Section 3, then License Fee will be prorated accordingly. SCE shall send payment to Licensor via wire transfer or ACH.
- 7. <u>Licensor's Obligations</u>. Licensor shall be responsible for the following if and only if the License Area is not affected by a PSPS event:
 - (a) Provision of the License Area including air conditioning, heating, wireless internet access and reasonable access to restrooms;
 - (b) Labor, equipment and materials to prepare the License Area and any necessary support elements upon notice of PSPS Event including but not limited to setup of tables, chairs, refrigerators; and
 - (c) Labor required to revert the License Area space back to the condition it was in prior to its use for the PSPS Event, reasonable wear and tear excepted.
- 8. <u>SCE's Obligations</u>. SCE shall be responsible for all other materials and equipment not described in Section 7 in order to successfully manage the PSPS Event.
- 9. Use of License Area.
 - (a) As Is. To Licensor's current actual knowledge, the License Area and the property on which License Area resides comply with all laws, including the Americans with Disabilities Act and other accessibility laws. SCE accepts the License Area "as-is," "where-is" and "with-all-faults," subject to all applicable zoning, municipal, county and state laws, ordinances, and regulations governing and regulating the use of the License Area. SCE may request Licensor to perform

alterations, repairs, or improvements to the License Area unrelated to applicable laws, but SCE understands and agrees that Licensor shall not be obligated to make any such alterations, repairs or improvements at any time.

- (b) <u>General Provisions</u>. The demised License Area shall be of sufficient size to comfortably accommodate up to forty (40) people at any time. Licensor shall ensure the space is clean, with appropriate lighting and ventilation including air conditioning, heating, and access to restrooms.
- (c) Operation During PSPS Event. Licensor shall have at least one point of contact on site for SCE staff with whom to coordinate PSPS Activities. SCE may provide five (5) eight-foot folding tables and forty (40) folding chairs to be stored at the License Area for use only during the PSPS Event. Licensor shall replace these tables and chairs if they are damaged during storage or outside of a PSPS Event.
- (d) <u>Restoration</u>. SCE shall exercise reasonable care in the conduct of PSPS Activities in the License Area. Upon SCE's ceasing to use the License Area in connection with a particular PSPS Event, SCE shall remove all SCE signage, charging kiosk(s) and other supplies and materials and personal property of SCE and SCE's Representatives.
- (e) <u>Safe Condition</u>. Licensor shall maintain the License Area in a good, clean, safe and sanitary condition during Use Days.
- (f) <u>Lawful Use Only</u>. SCE shall not use the License Area or permit anything to be done in or about the License Area during Use Days that will in any way conflict with any law, statute, zoning restriction, ordinance or governmental rule or regulation or requirement relating to the use or occupancy of the License Area. During Use Days, SCE shall not allow the License Area to be used for any unlawful or objectionable purpose, nor shall SCE cause, maintain or permit any nuisance in, on or about the License Area.
- (g) <u>Mechanic's Liens</u>. SCE shall keep the Property free and clear of all mechanic's liens arising, or alleged to arise, in connection with any work performed, labor or materials supplied or delivered, or similar activities performed by SCE or at SCE's request or for SCE's benefit. If any mechanic's liens are placed on the Property in connection with SCE's use or SCE's Activities, SCE shall diligently pursue all necessary actions to remove such liens from title, either by payment or by recording a lien release bond in the manner specified in California Civil Code Section 8424 or any successor statute.
- 10. <u>Notices</u>. All notices under this Agreement shall be made in accordance with Exhibit A. Notices must, unless otherwise specified herein, be in writing and may be delivered by hand delivery, first class United States mail, overnight courier service, or e-mail. Notice provided in accordance with this Section 10 will be deemed given as follows:
 - (a) Notice by e-mail or hand delivery will be deemed given at the close of business on the day actually received if received during business hours on

- a business day, and otherwise will be deemed given at the close of business on the next business day.
- (b) Notice by overnight United States mail or courier service will be deemed given on the next business day after such Notice was sent out;
- (c) Notice by first class United States mail will be deemed given two (2) business days after the postmarked date;

Notices will be effective on the date deemed given, unless a different date for the Notice to go into effect is stated in another section of this Agreement.

A Party may change its designated representatives, addresses and other contact information by providing Notice of same in accordance herewith.

All Notices, requests, invoices, statements, or payments related to this Agreement must reference the ID# and clearly identify the fact, circumstance, request, issue, dispute or matter to which such Notice relates.

- 11. <u>Limitation of Liability.</u> In no event shall either Licensor or SCE or any of their employees, contractors, agents or representatives be liable to the other Party for any direct, indirect, consequential, special, incidental, or punitive damages under any theory of liability, including, but not limited to, tort, contract, indemnity, breach of warranty, or strict liability in connection with this Agreement. In addition, the aggregate amount of each Party's liability or damages to the other Party in connection with this Agreement shall not exceed Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000). This Section 10 shall survive the expiration or earlier termination of this License Agreement.
- 12. <u>Indemnity</u>. Each Party shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless the other Party and its governing body, officers, agents, and employees from and against all third-Party claims, losses, actions, demands, damages, costs, expenses (including, but not limited to, reasonable attorneys' fees and court costs) (collectively, "Claims") to the extent such Claims result from the indemnifying Party's negligence or intentional or unlawful misconduct related to the indemnifying Party's performance of this Agreement. This Section 11 shall survive the expiration or earlier termination of this License Agreement.
- 13. <u>Insurance</u>. Throughout the Term of this Agreement, Parties, and to the extent not covered by each Parties' insurance policies, their contractors and subcontractors, shall, at their own expense, provide and maintain in effect the insurance policies and minimum limits of coverage specified in this Section 13, and such additional coverage as may be required by applicable laws, with insurance companies which are authorized to do business in the state in which the services are to be performed and which have an A.M. Best's Insurance Rating of not less than A, VII. The minimum insurance requirements specified herein do not in any way limit or relieve either Party of any obligation assumed elsewhere in this Agreement, including either Party's defense and indemnity obligations.

- (a) <u>Workers' Compensation Insurance</u> with the statutory limits required by the state having jurisdiction over each Party's employees; Such insurance shall include a waiver of subrogation in favor of the other Party;
- (b) Commercial General Liability Insurance shall be written on an "occurrence," not a "claims-made" basis, covering all operations by or on behalf of each Party arising out of or connected with this Agreement, including coverage for bodily injury and property damage. Such insurance shall bear a per occurrence limit of One Million dollars (\$1,000,000), and annual aggregate of Two Million dollars (\$2,000,000), exclusive of defense costs, for all coverages. Such insurance shall (1) name the other Party as an additional insured, and (2) include a waiver of subrogation in favor of the other Party, and (3) contain standard cross-liability and severability of interest provisions.
- (c) <u>Commercial Automobile Liability Insurance</u> covering bodily injury and property damage with a combined single limit of One Million dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence. Such insurance shall cover liability arising out of each Party's use of all owned (if any), non-owned and hired vehicles, including trailers or semi-trailers, in the performance of this Agreement.

(d) <u>Certificates of Insurance.</u>

Within fourteen (14) days after the Effective Date, and within fourteen (14) days after coverage is renewed or replaced, each Party shall furnish to the other Party certificates of insurance evidencing the coverage required in this Section 13. All deductibles and co-insurance retentions applicable to the insurance in Section 13 shall be paid by each respective Party. Each Party, or its insurance broker or agent, shall provide the other Party with at least thirty (30) days' prior written Notice in the event of cancellation of coverage. Receipt of documents that do not comply with the requirements stated herein, or either Party's failure to provide documents that comply with the requirements stated herein, shall not limit or relieve either Party of the duties and responsibility of maintaining insurance in compliance with the requirements in this Section 13 and shall not constitute a waiver of any of the requirements in this Section 13.

(e) Parties may self-insure the insurance requirements of this Section and shall provide proof of self-insurance.

14. Miscellaneous.

- (a) <u>Governing Law</u>. This Agreement shall in all respects be interpreted, enforced, and governed by and under the laws of the State of California.
- (b) <u>No Waiver</u>. Any waiver with respect to any provision of this Agreement shall not be effective unless in writing and signed by the Party against whom it is asserted. The waiver of any provision of this Agreement by a Party shall

- not be construed as a waiver of a subsequent breach or failure of the same term or condition or as a waiver of any other provision of this Agreement.
- (c) <u>Counterparts</u>. This Agreement may be executed in identical counterpart copies, each of which shall be an original, but all of which taken together shall constitute one and the same agreement.
- (d) <u>Authority</u>. Each Party to this Agreement warrants to the other that it has the right and authority to enter into and to perform its obligations under this Agreement, without the consent of any third Party, and that the person signing below is authorized to bind such Party.
- (e) <u>Rules of Construction</u>. All references to time shall be in Pacific Daylight Time when California observes Daylight Savings time and Pacific Standard Time otherwise, unless otherwise stated.
- (f) <u>Exhibits and Entire Agreement</u>. Exhibit A attached to this Agreement are a part hereof and incorporated herein by this reference. This Agreement may not be amended, except by a written agreement executed by both Parties.
- (g) <u>Electronic Signatures</u>. This Agreement may be executed by electronic signatures (*e.g.*, using DocuSign or e-SignLive) or signatures transmitted in portable document format ("<u>PDF</u>"), and copies of this Agreement executed and delivered by means of electronic or PDF signatures shall have the same force and effect as copies hereof executed and delivered with original manually executed signatures. The Parties may rely upon electronic and PDF signatures as if such signatures were manually executed originals and agree that an electronic or PDF signature page may be introduced into evidence in any proceeding arising out of or related to this Agreement as if it were an original manually executed signature page.
- (h) <u>Successors and Assigns</u>. This Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the heirs, personal representatives, successors, and assigns of each Party.
- (i) <u>Entire Agreement</u>. This Agreement supersedes all previous oral and written agreements between and representations by or on behalf of the Parties and constitutes the entire agreement of the Parties with respect to the subject matter hereof. This Agreement may not be amended, except by a written agreement executed by both Parties.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the City Council:

- a. Adopt Resolution No. 8010 (Attachment "A") calling and giving notice of the General Municipal Election to be held on Tuesday, November 3, 2020, for the election of two City Councilmembers to each serve four year terms and one City Councilmember to fill the two-year, unexpired balance of the four-year term of the Council seat vacated by former Councilman Antonio Lopez in September 2019;
- b. Approve the request to consolidate the election with the Statewide General Election; request that the Board of Supervisors of the County of Los Angeles consent, and effectuate such consolidation to issue instructions to the Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk of the County of Los Angeles "County Registrar" to take any and all steps necessary for the holding of the consolidated election; and
- c. Adopt regulations pursuant to Elections Code (EC) Sections 13307 through EC 13313, pertaining to candidate statements and related materials submitted to the Electorate.

BACKGROUND:

- 1. On March 7, 2017, Councilmembers Joel Fajardo and Robert C. Gonzales were elected to each serve one approximate four year term, which will expire on November 3, 2020.
- 2. On August 21, 2017, the City Council adopted Ordinance No. 1668 (Attachment "B"), to change the City's General Municipal Elections from March of odd-numbered years to November of even-numbered years to coincide with the statewide general election.

- 3. On August 19, 2019, Councilmember Antonio Lopez submitted his resignation, effective on September 30, 2019.
- 4. On October 7, 2019, the City Council appointed Mary Mendoza to fill the seat vacated by former Councilmember Lopez. Pursuant to Government Code Section 36512, Councilmember Mendoza may serve until the next general election in November 2020.

ANALYSIS:

On November 3, 2020, registered voters in the City of San Fernando will have the opportunity to elect two Councilmembers of the five-member City Council for a term of four years each, and one Councilmember to fill the two-year unexpired balance of the four-year term of the Council seat vacated by the resignation of former Councilmember Antonio Lopez on September 30, 2019. The two Councilmember seats for the four year terms are presently occupied by incumbents Joel Fajardo, Robert C. Gonzales, and the third seat if for the balance of the unexpired four year term, presently occupied by appointed incumbent Mary Mendoza.

To request consolidation with the Statewide General Election to be held on the same day, the City Council must call for the General Municipal Election and file a request with the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors for consolidation (see Resolution included as Attachment "A").

In conjunction with the calling of the Municipal General Election, and pursuant to Section 10002 of the Elections Code, the City can request that the Board of Supervisors permit the County Clerk to render services in conducting the Municipal General Election.

The County's election calendar for the November 3rd election identifies July 6, 2020, as the last day for the City Council to adopt a resolution requesting to consolidate with the Statewide General Election, calling and giving notice of the General Municipal Election for the election of three City Councilmembers, and adopting regulations pertaining to materials submitted to the Electorate.

The opening of the candidate filing period begins at 8:00 a.m. on Monday, July 13, 2020 and ends at 5:00 p.m. on Friday, August 7, 2020. This is the period in which potential candidates may file nomination documents with the City Clerk's Department. If an incumbent does not file the proper paperwork to run for re-election, the candidate filing period for that position will be extended to 5:00 p.m. on Wednesday, August 12, 2020.

It should be noted that, due to the COVID-19 pandemic and the Safer at Home Health Order issued by the LA County Department of Public Health, guidance and options for candidates and the City Clerk "Elections Official" were provided by the Los Angeles County Registrar-

Recorder/County Clerk (Attachment "C") to allow candidate documents be transmitted via mail, e-mail, or website encrypted, in additional to the traditional in person method.

BUDGET IMPACT:

The Los Angeles County Registrar/Recorder provides an election costs estimator tool on their website to assist with estimating the City's election costs. Based on the information provided through the Registrar/Recorder website and past election costs, the Fiscal Year 2020-2021 City Budget includes \$50,000 to cover the cost of the November 3, 2020 General Municipal Election.

CONCLUSION:

In accordance with California Election law, staff recommends that the City Council adopt Resolution No. 8010 calling and giving notice of the election on November 3, 2020 for the election of three City Councilmembers, requesting election consolidation, requesting that the Board of Supervisors of the County of Los Angeles authorize the Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk to perform election services, and adopting regulations pertaining to candidate statements.

RESOLUTION NO. 8010

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN FERNANDO, CALIFORNIA (1) CALLING AND GIVING NOTICE OF THE GENERAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 3, 2020, FOR THE ELECTION OF THREE **CITY COUNCILMEMBERS**; **(2)** REQUESTING CONSOLIDATION OF **SUCH ELECTION** WITH THE STATEWIDE GENERAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON THE SAME DAY; (3) REQUESTING THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF LOS ANGELES TO ISSUE INSTRUCTIONS TO THE REGISTRAR-RECORDER/COUNTY CLERK TO TAKE ANY AND ALL STEPS NECESSARY FOR THE HOLDING OF THE CONSOLIDATED ELECTION; AND (4) **ADOPTING** REGULATIONS PERTAINING TO CANDIDATE STATEMENTS

WHEREAS, under the provision of the laws relating to General Law cities in the State of California, a General Municipal Election of the City of San Fernando (the "City") shall be conducted on Tuesday, November 3, 2020, for the purpose of electing two (2) members of the City Council for the full term of four years; and one member of the City Council for the remaining two year term of a four year term due to a mid-term council vacancy that occurred in September 2019; and

WHEREAS, it is desirable that said election be consolidated with the County-administered General Election to be held on the same date and that within the City the precincts, polling places, and election officers of the two elections be the same, and that the Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk of the County of Los Angeles ("County Registrar") canvass the returns of the City's General Municipal Election and that it be held in all respects as if it were part and parcel of the County-administered General Election; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to secure the consent and order of the Board of Supervisors of the County of Los Angeles (the "Board of Supervisors") to effectuate such consolidation; and

WHEREAS, the City shall compensate the County Registrar for all necessary expenses incurred by the County in performing election services for the City; and

WHEREAS, the City Council approves the printing of the information for said election in the foreign languages requiring translation pursuant to the Voting Rights Act of 1965; and

WHEREAS, Elections Code Section 13307 provides that the City may adopt regulations pertaining to the recovery of certain costs associated with the printing, handling, translation, and mailing of candidate statements as filed with the elections officer; and

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN FERNANDO, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE, FIND, DETERMINE AND ORDER AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The recitals above and findings therein are true and correct and incorporated into the body of this Resolution by this reference.

SECTION 2. That pursuant to the requirements of the laws of the State of California relating to General Law cities, the City Council hereby orders and calls a General Municipal Election to be held in the City of San Fernando, California on Tuesday, November 3, 2020, to be consolidated with the County-administered General Election to be held on the same day for the purpose of electing two (2) members of the City Council for the full term of four years; and one member of the City Council for the remaining two year term which is the unexpired balance of the four year term of the Council seat vacated by former Councilman Antonio Lopez in September of 2019.

SECTION 3. Pursuant to the requirements of Section 10403 of the Elections Code, it is respectfully requested that the Board of Supervisors consent and agree to the consolidation of the City's General Municipal Election on Tuesday, November 3, 2020 with the County-administered election to be held on the same date.

SECTION 4. In connection with the County Registrar's administration of the City's November 3, 2020 General Municipal Election, the City further requests that the County Registrar be authorized and directed to: (a) review and verify vote by mail applications and signatures; (b) conduct registered voter verifications (including signature verifications) associated with the processing of any proposed General Municipal Election ballot measure; (c) provide the City with the appropriate election precinct data, to the extent required; (d) make available to the City such election facilities, ballot casting equipment and assistance as may be necessary to conduct the election returns; (f) print and supply ballots for the election; (g) mail the City's sample ballots, including ballot measure question, arguments, rebuttals and impartial analysis; and (h) administer the City's General Municipal Election in all respects as if it were part and parcel of any other County Registrar administered election, implementing all such legally required or customarily employed measures and practices as may be necessary to conduct the election in a timely and legally compliant manner.

SECTION 5. The City shall reimburse the Country Registrar for any costs associated with the administration of said election upon presentation to the City of a properly approved bill.

SECTION 6. Pursuant to Section 13307 of the Elections Code, each candidate for elective office to be voted for at the City's November 3, 2020, General Municipal Election may prepare a candidate statement on a form acceptable to the County Registrar, as applicable, and made available through the City Clerk.

SECTION 7. Pursuant to Section 13307(a)(1) of the Elections Code candidate statements *may* include the following:

(A) The name, age, and occupation of the candidate; and

- (B) A brief description of no more than 200 words of the candidate's education and qualifications as expressed by the candidate himself or herself.
- **SECTION 8.** Pursuant to Elections Code Section 13307(a)(1), candidate statements *shall not* include the following:
 - (A) The party affiliation of the candidate; or
 - (B) References to membership or activity in partisan political organizations.
- **SECTION 9.** All prospective candidates should be aware of the holding in *Dean v. Superior Court* (1998) 62 Cal.App.4th 638, which holds that a statement prepared by a candidate for inclusion in the voters' pamphlet *may not* include comments or statements concerning the qualifications (or alleged lack of qualifications) of one's opponents. Candidates, in an abundance of caution, should avoid making any reference to opponents in their candidate statements. Candidates should seek the advice of private legal counsel if unsure as to whether their candidate statement does or does not comply with applicable law before filing.
- **SECTION 10.** The candidate statement shall be filed in typewritten form at the Office of the City Clerk at the time the candidate's nomination papers are filed. The candidate statement may be withdrawn, but not changed, during the period for filing nomination papers and until 5:00 p.m. of the next working day after the close of the nomination period.
- SECTION 11. Subject to any logistical constraints imposed by the County Registrar by virtue of consolidation, the City Clerk shall have translated (from the English to relevant foreign languages authorized under the Voting Rights Act of 1965) and printed in the voters' pamphlet only the candidate statements of those candidates who request such translation and printing at the time of filing of the candidate statements.
- **SECTION 12.** No candidate for any elected office of the City shall be permitted to include additional materials in the voters' pamphlet and sample ballot package.
- SECTION 13. Each candidate for any of the offices to be elected at the General Municipal Election to be conducted on November 3, 2020, who files a candidate statement shall, as a condition of having his or her candidate statement included in the voters' pamphlet, concurrently deposit with the City Clerk an amount, as reasonably estimated by the City Clerk, to pay in advance his or her estimated *pro rata* share of the actual costs of printing and handling such candidate statements incurred by the City and/or the County Registrar as a result of providing such service at the time of filing such statement with the City Clerk. In the event that the amount paid as a deposit by a candidate includes overpayment of actual costs incurred by the City and/or the County Registrar, the City Clerk shall prorate the excess amount among the candidates and refund the excess amount paid within thirty (30) days following the date of the election.
- **SECTION 14.** The City Clerk shall provide each candidate or candidate's representative a copy of this Resolution at the time nominating petitions are issued.
- **SECTION 15.** The ballots to be used at the election shall be in form and content as required by law.

SECTION 16. The City Clerk is authorized, instructed and directed to coordinate with the County Registrar to procure and furnish any and all official ballots, notices, printed matter and all supplies, equipment and paraphernalia that may be necessary in order to properly and lawfully conduct the election.

SECTION 17. The polls for the election shall be open at seven o'clock a.m. of the day of the election and shall remain open continuously from that time until eight o'clock p.m. of the same day when the polls shall be closed, pursuant to Elections Code Section 10242, except as provided in Section 14401 of the Elections Code.

SECTION 18. In all particulars not recited in this Resolution, the election shall be held and conducted as provided by law for holding municipal elections.

SECTION 19. In the event of a tie vote (if any two or more persons receive an equal and the highest number of votes for an office) as certified by the County Registrar, the City Council, in accordance with Elections Code Section 15651(a), shall set a date and time and place and summon the candidates who have received the tie votes to appear and will determine the tie by lot (i.e., coin toss, draw straws, drawing of names).

SECTION 20. The City Clerk shall forward without delay, a copy of this Resolution to the appropriate public agency which shall be assisting the City with the conduct of its General Municipal Election.

SECTION 21. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption by the City Council and the City Clerk shall certify to the passage and adoption of this Resolution and enter it into the book of original Resolutions.

ORDINANCE NO. 1668

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN FERNANDO, CALIFORNIA, REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 1452 AND MOVING THE DATE OF GENERAL MUNICIPAL ELECTIONS FROM THE FIRST TUESDAY AFTER THE FIRST MONDAY IN MARCH OF ODD-NUMBERED YEARS TO THE FIRST TUESDAY AFTER THE FIRST MONDAY IN NOVEMBER OF EVEN-NUMBERED YEARS BEGINNING NOVEMBER 6, 2018

WHEREAS, general law cities, such as the City of San Fernando (the "City"), are obligated to conduct general and special municipal elections in accordance with the California Elections Code (the "Elections Code"), per Elections Code Section 10101, et seq.;

WHEREAS, the City currently conducts its general elections on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in March in each odd-numbered year, pursuant to City Council Ordinance No. 1452 and Elections Code Section 1301;

WHEREAS, on September 1, 2015, Governor Jerry Brown signed Senate Bill 415 ("SB 415") into law;

WHEREAS, commencing January 1, 2018, SB 415 prohibits the City from holding an election on any date other than a statewide election date, as doing so in the past has resulted in turnout that is at least twenty-five percent (25%) below the average turnout in that jurisdiction in the last four statewide general elections;

WHEREAS, Section 14052(b) of the Elections Code allows the City to hold elections on dates other than statewide election dates, after January 1, 2018, if it adopts a plan to consolidate futures elections with statewide elections no later than the November 8, 2022 statewide general election;

WHEREAS, on July 18, 2016, the City adopted Resolution No. 7754, which set forth the City's intention and plan to begin holding its elections on the first Tuesday after the First Monday in November no later than November 8, 2022; and

WHEREAS, on July 17, 2017, the City Council conducted a public hearing and considered approval of an ordinance to begin holding its elections on the November statewide election date beginning on November 8, 2022. After discussion, the City Council directed staff to accelerate the switch to statewide election dates and to prepare an ordinance for City Council consideration to switch to statewide election dates beginning with the November 6, 2018 election.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN FERNANDO, CALIFORNIA DOES HEREBY ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The facts set forth in the recitals above are true and correct and incorporated herein by reference.

SECTION 2. Ordinance No. 1452 is hereby repealed and rescinded in its entirety and superseded by this Ordinance No. 1668.

SECTION 3. Resolution No. 7754 is hereby repealed and rescinded in its entirety.

SECTION 4. Pursuant to Elections Code Section 1301 and in compliance with SB 415, general municipal elections for the City of San Fernando are hereby moved from the first Tuesday after the first Monday in March of odd-numbered years to the first Tuesday after the First Monday in November of even-numbered years, commencing November 6, 2018. In recognition of the foregoing and subject to approval of this ordinance and the proposed change of election date contemplated herein by the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors, Division 3 of Chapter 2 (Administration) of the San Fernando Municipal Code, which is currently designated as "Reserved" is hereby amended in its entirety to now state the following,

Division 3. - General Municipal Elections.

2.91 Date of General Municipal Elections; Consolidation with County.

- (a) The city shall hold its general municipal elections on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November of each even-numbered year, commencing with a general municipal election to be held on November 6, 2018.
- (b) General municipal elections held pursuant to this Section be consolidated with the concurrent statewide election of the same date administered by the Registrar-Recorder for the County of Los Angeles unless the County Board of Supervisors denies such consolidation pursuant to Elections Code Section 10402.5. In the event the County Board of Supervisors denies consolidation in any given year, the City reserves the right to administer the election on its own, through the office of the City Clerk, or in cooperation with any other public agency to the extent authorized by law.

SECTION 5. In order to accommodate the new election schedule, the terms for City elected officials who were victorious at elections in 2015 and 2017 shall be subject to a reduction of approximately four months from terms of office as follows:

SECTION 6. In accordance with Elections Code Section 10403.5(b), this Ordinance shall cause no elected city terms of office to be increased or decreased by more than twelve (12) months.

<u>SECTION 7.</u> <u>Inconsistent Provisions</u>. Any provision of the San Fernando City Code or appendices thereto that conflicts with the provisions of this Ordinance, to the extent of such conflict and no further, is hereby repealed or modified to the extent necessary to affect the provisions of this Ordinance.

SECTION 8. Severability. If any section, subsection, subdivision, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance, or any part thereof is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a decision of any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance or any part thereof. The City Council hereby declares that it would have passed each section, subsection, subdivision, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase thereof, irrespective of the fact that any one or more section, subsection, subdivision, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase would be subsequently declared invalid or unconstitutional.

SECTION 9. Publication. The Mayor shall sign and the City Clerk shall attest to the passage of this Ordinance. The City Clerk shall cause the same to be published once in a newspaper of general circulation within fifteen (15) days after its adoption.

SECTION 10. Effective Date/Operative Date. This Ordinance shall become effective thirty (30) days after a second reading and adoption. This Ordinance shall become operative upon approval by the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors, per Elections Code Section 1301(b).

SECTION 11. The City Clerk is directed to forward without delay to the County of Los Angeles Board of Supervisors and to the County of Los Angeles Registrar/Recorder/ County Clerk, each a certified copy of this Ordinance.

RE: Presidential General: County Local/Candidate Filing

In light of COVID-19 and the stay at home order issued by the Governor, several counties have inquired about county and local candidate filing that will take place during the summer for the November 2020 election. The purpose of this CCROV is to provide guidance and options for candidates and county elections officials to maintain health and safety during the candidate filing process.

Issuing Candidate Documents

Elections officials may issue candidate documents in person during available business hours or by appointment, via mail, via email, or via a website using an encrypted internet security protocol. If a candidate elects to receive the candidate documents via mail, email, or a website using an encrypted internet security protocol, to meet the requirements of Elections Code section 8028(b), the candidate must provide a written request to receive the documents in that manner.

Prior to issuing candidate documents, elections officials shall follow normal procedures and guidelines, such as verification of eligibility for the office sought and collecting the appropriate filing fee. The elections official shall determine the available method(s) for the candidate to submit the applicable filing fee for the office sought.

County and local election officials should provide information regarding these processes on their website and to any candidate which requests candidate documents.

Execution of Candidate Documents

Any documents that require an oath by the candidate may be executed in the presence of a notary, or in the alternative, in the office of the elections official

during available business hours, by appointment, or via an online video conferencing service.

Receipt of Candidate Documents and Filing Deadlines

A candidate may electronically submit their completed documents to the elections official so that the elections official may begin the review and verification process as soon as is practicable. However, in order to be a qualified candidate for the office in which they seek, the completed documents with original signatures must be received by the elections official by the close of the nomination period for that particular office.

To submit the original documents, the candidate may submit those documents to the office of the elections official during available business hours, by appointment, in a drop box provided by the elections official, or via mail or other delivery service.

Reminder to Candidates

Elections officials must provide clear written guidance to candidates regarding the requirement of submitting the candidate documents with original signatures to the elections official by the official close of the nomination period. The candidate must acknowledge receipt of the written guidance in the manner provided by the elections official. A candidate who has elected to submit their candidate documents electronically, so the candidate filing process may begin, must be made aware that they must submit the original documents to the elections official in a manner that will ensure that those original documents are in the possession of the elections official prior to the close of the nomination period. Any candidate who fails to timely submit the candidate documents with original signatures by the close of the nomination period will not be included on the ballot for that office.

The Secretary of State's office will send a survey to county elections officials prior to the opening of candidate filing to learn what process each county will follow.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the City Council:

- a. Adopt Resolution No. 8016 (Attachment "A") and approve related certification documents (Attachments "B," "C," and "D") to effectuate a contract amendment between the City of San Fernando and the California Public Employees' Retirement System (CalPERS); and
- b. Authorize the City Manager to make non-substantive corrections and execute all related documents.

BACKGROUND:

- During the special budget meetings in May and June, 2020, the City Council directed staff to
 explore CalPERS requirements with respect to amending the City's contract to provide
 Government Code Section 20903 (Two Years Additional Service Credit) for local
 miscellaneous and safety members, and bring back that information, along with estimated
 cost, for further consideration.
- 2. During special budget meetings in June 2020, staff advised Council that, per discussions with our bargaining units, approximately ten (10) miscellaneous employees are deemed eligible to take advantage of the CalPERS early retirement program.
- 3. On June 29, 2020, CalPERS approved a tentative "Schedule of Agency Actions" for planning the contract amendment. CalPERS recommends the schedule below:

a. Adopt Resolution of Intention:

b. Identify Costs in Public Meeting:

 e. Contract Amendment Becomes Effective: August 5, 2020

ANALYSIS:

CalPERS offers a retirement incentive program to member agencies that allows the agency to provide two years of service credit to eligible staff in lieu of implementing layoffs and/or furloughs. This program provides a mechanism that allows agencies to reduce staff through a voluntary separation arrangement and provides immediate payroll savings.

In order to take advantage of this CalPERS retirement incentive program, the City must amend the current contract with CalPERS pursuant to Government Code Section 20903. Amending the City's contract requires the following actions:

- 1. Adopt a Resolution of Intention and Exhibit Amendment to Contract to provide Section 20903 (Two Years Additional Service Credit) benefits (Attachment "A");
- 2. Certification of Governing Body's Action (Attachment "B") to adopt the Resolution of Intention;
- 3. Certification of Compliance with Government Code Section 20903 (Attachment "C") to attest that the City is offering the retirement incentive as it is in the best financial interest of the City and to avoid impending layoffs or other personnel reductions; and
- 4. Certification of Compliance with Government Code Section 7507 (Attachment "D") to attest that the estimated cost savings have been provided at a public meeting (see Budget Impact Section).

The CalPERS retirement incentive program offers two additional years of service credit to employees that meet minimum retirement age and years of service eligibility requirements. However, the City must eliminate the retiree's position, or another position in the same job classification, department or organizational unit, once it is vacated by the eligible employee. Consequently, the City can only offer the retirement incentive program to positions that can be eliminated without significantly impacting services.

^{*}Note: Adoption of the ordinance to amend the CalPERS contract must be at least 20 days after adopting the Resolution of Intention.

In order to receive the service credit, the City must identify which positions are eligible to receive the retirement incentive and the employee(s) in that position must elect to retire within the period designated by the City ("Retirement Period"). The Retirement Period must not be less than 90 days, but not more than 180 days.

In consideration of the City's current financial situation caused by a significant loss of revenue due to COVID-19 related economic restrictions, there is an immediate need for budgetary savings. Consequently, staff is recommending a 90-day Retirement Period, which will begin upon the effective date of the contract amendment.

BUDGET IMPACT:

Personnel staff used the CalPERS Calculation of Estimated Employer Costs formula to determine the eligible employees' service credit costs; this formula takes into account current salary, age, Post- Retirement Survivor allowance and other factors to determine service credit costs.

The estimated total cost of providing the additional service credit to ten (10) eligible miscellaneous employees is approximately \$605,000 for this fiscal year. This cost is projected to increase by approximately 1.05% each fiscal year. The estimated total compensation (salary and benefits) for the ten (10) eligible miscellaneous employees is approximately \$1.28 million for this fiscal year.

Thus, the estimated total savings for FY 2020-2021 is approximately \$675,000, which is derived by subtracting the total compensation estimate (\$1.28 million) from the service credit amount (\$605,000) listed above.

CONCLUSION:

City Council approval of the attached Resolution of Intention and related documents to amend the City's contract with CalPERS to provide the two-year additional service credit to local miscellaneous members is necessary, and is the first step towards providing this retirement incentive to eligible employees. In accordance with the provisions of Government Code 20903, staff will bring an Urgency Ordinance to the City Council for adoption on August 3, 2020 in order to complete the amendment process.



- A. Paragraphs 1 through 17 are hereby stricken from said contract as executed effective September 8, 2012, and hereby replaced by the following paragraphs numbered 1 through 20 inclusive:
 - 1. All words and terms used herein which are defined in the Public Employees' Retirement Law shall have the meaning as defined therein unless otherwise specifically provided. "Normal retirement age" shall mean age 60 for classic local miscellaneous members entering membership in the miscellaneous classification on or prior to November 12, 2005, age 55 for classic local miscellaneous members entering membership for the first time in the miscellaneous classification after November 12, 2005, age 62 for new local miscellaneous members, age 50 for classic local police members entering membership in the police classification on or prior to September 8, 2012, age 55 for classic local fire members and for those classic local police members entering membership for the first time in the police classification after September 8, 2012 and age 57 for new local safety members

I LEASE DO NOT SIGN "EXHIBIT ONLY"

- Public Agency shall participate in the Public Employees' Retirement System from and after October 1, 1946 making its employees as hereinafter provided, members of said System subject to all provisions of the Public Employees' Retirement Law except such as apply only on election of a contracting agency and are not provided for herein and to all amendments to said Law hereafter enacted except those, which by express provisions thereof, apply only on the election of a contracting agency.
- Public Agency agrees to indemnify, defend and hold harmless the California Public Employees' Retirement System (CalPERS) and its trustees, agents and employees, the CalPERS Board of Administration, and the California Public Employees' Retirement Fund from any claims, demands, actions, losses, liabilities, damages, judgments, expenses and costs, including but not limited to interest, penalties and attorney fees that may arise as a result of any of the following:
 - (a) Public Agency's election to provide retirement benefits, provisions or formulas under this Contract that are different than the retirement benefits, provisions or formulas provided under the Public Agency's prior non-CalPERS retirement program.
 - (b) Any dispute, disagreement, claim, or proceeding (including without limitation arbitration, administrative hearing, or litigation) between Public Agency and its employees (or their representatives) which relates to Public Agency's election to amend this Contract to provide retirement benefits, provisions or formulas that are different than such employees' existing retirement benefits, provisions or formulas.
 - (c) Public Agency's agreement with a third party other than CalPERS to provide retirement benefits, provisions, or formulas that are different than the retirement benefits, provisions or formulas provided under this Contract and provided for under the California Public Employees' Retirement Law.
- 4. Employees of Public Agency in the following classes shall become members of said Retirement System except such in each such class as are excluded by law or this agreement:
 - a. Local Fire Fighters (herein referred to as local safety members);
 - Local Police Officers (herein referred to as local safety members);
 - c. Employees other than local safety members (herein referred to as local miscellaneous members).

PLEASE DO NOT SIGN "EXHIBIT ONLY"

 In addition to the classes of employees excluded from membership by said Retirement Law, the following classes of employees shall not become members of said Retirement System:

NO ADDITIONAL EXCLUSIONS

- 6. Public Agency and the San Fernando Redevelopment Agency have agreed to a merger of their contracts, and this contract shall be a continuation of the benefits of the contract of the San Fernando Redevelopment Agency, pursuant to Section 20567.5 of the Government Code. Such merger is effective as of June 22, 1985. Legislation repealed said Section effective January 1, 1988.
- 7. The percentage of final compensation to be provided for each year of credited prior and current service for classic local miscellaneous members in employment before and not on or after September 7, 2002 shall be determined in accordance with Section 21354 of said Retirement Law, subject to the reduction provided therein for service on and after January 1, 1960, the effective date of Social Security coverage, for members whose service has been included in Federal Social Security (2% at age 55 Full and Modified).
- 8. The percentage of final compensation to be provided for each year of credited prior and current service for classic local miscellaneous members in employment on or after September 7, 2002 and not entering membership for the first time in the miscellaneous classification after November 12, 2005 shall be determined in accordance with Section 21354.3 of said Retirement Law, subject to the reduction provided therein for service on and after January 1, 1960, the effective date of Social Security coverage, for members whose service has been included in Federal Social Security (3% at age 60 Full and Modified).
- 9. The percentage of final compensation to be provided for each year of credited current service as a classic local miscellaneous member entering membership for the first time in the miscellaneous classification after November 12, 2005 shall be determined in accordance with Section 21354 of said Retirement Law subject to the reduction provided therein for Federal Social Security (2% at age 55 Modified).
- 10. The percentage of final compensation to be provided for each year of credited prior and current service as a new local miscellaneous member shall be determined in accordance with Section 7522.20 of said Retirement Law (2% at age 62 Supplemental to Federal Social Security).
- 11. The percentage of final compensation to be provided for each year of credited prior and current service as a classic local fire member shall be determined in accordance with Section 21366 of said Retirement Law (Onehalf pay at age 55 Full).

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- 12. The percentage of final compensation to be provided for each year of credited prior and current service as a classic local police member entering membership in the police classification on or prior to September 8, 2012 shall be determined in accordance with Section 21362.2 of said Retirement Law (3% at age 50 Full).
- 13. The percentage of final compensation to be provided for each year of credited current service as a classic local police member entering membership for the first time in the police classification after September 8, 2012 shall be determined in accordance with Section 21363.1 of said Retirement Law (3% at age 55 Full).
- 14. The percentage of final compensation to be provided for each year of credited prior and current service as a new local fire member shall be determined in accordance with Section 7522.25(b) of said Retirement Law (2% at age 57 Full).
- 15. The percentage of final compensation to be provided for each year of credited prior and current service as a new local police member shall be determined in accordance with Section 7522.25(d) of said Retirement Law (2.7% at age 57 Full).
- 16. Public Agency elected and elects to be subject to the following optional provisions:
 - Section 21571 (Basic Level of 1959 Survivor Benefits) for local fire members only.
 - Section 21574 (Fourth Level of 1959 Survivor Benefits) for local miscellaneous members and local police members only.
 - c. Section 21335 (5% Cost-of-Living Allowance, base year 1982) for those local police members entering membership on or prior to January 6, 1994, Section 21335 (5% Cost-of-Living Allowance, base year 2002) for those local miscellaneous members entering membership on or prior to November 12, 2005 and Section 21335 (3% Cost-of-Living Allowance, base year 2005) for those local miscellaneous members entering membership after November 12, 2005.
 - Section 20042 (One-Year Final Compensation) for classic local miscellaneous members and for those classic local police members entering membership on or prior to January 16, 1994.
 - Section 21024 (Military Service Credit as Public Service) for local miscellaneous members and local police members only.
 - f. Section 20965 (Credit for Unused Sick Leave) for local miscellaneous members only.

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- g. Section 21548 (Pre-Retirement Option 2W Death Benefit) for local safety members only.
- h. Section 20475 (Different Level of Benefits). Section 20037 (Three-Year Final Compensation) and Section 21329 (2% Annual Cost-of-Living Allowance Increase) is applicable to classic local police members entering membership for the first time with this agency in the police classification after January 6, 1994.

Section 21354 (2% @ 55 Modified formula) and Section 21335 (3% Annual Cost-of-Living Allowance Increase is applicable to classic local miscellaneous members entering membership for the first time in the miscellaneous classification with this agency after November 12, 2005.

Section 21363.1 (3% @ 55 Full formula) is applicable to classic local police members entering membership for the first time with this agency in the police classification after September 8, 2012.

- Section 20903 (Two Years Additional Service Credit) for local miscellaneous members and local police members only.
- 17. Public Agency shall contribute to said Retirement System the contributions determined by actuarial valuations of prior and future service liability with respect to local miscellaneous members and local safety members of said Retirement System.
- 18. Public Agency shall also contribute to said Retirement System as follows:
 - a. Contributions required per covered member on account of the 1959 Survivor Benefits provided under Section 21574 of said Retirement Law. (Subject to annual change.) In addition, all assets and liabilities of Public Agency and its employees shall be pooled in a single account, based on term insurance rates, for survivors of all local miscellaneous members and local safety members.
 - b. A reasonable amount, as fixed by the Board, payable in one installment within 60 days of date of contract to cover the costs of administering said System as it affects the employees of Public Agency, not including the costs of special valuations or of the periodic investigation and valuations required by law.
 - c. A reasonable amount, as fixed by the Board, payable in one installment as the occasions arise, to cover the costs of special valuations on account of employees of Public Agency, and costs of the periodic investigation and valuations required by law.

- 19. Contributions required of Public Agency and its employees shall be subject to adjustment by Board on account of amendments to the Public Employees' Retirement Law, and on account of the experience under the Retirement System as determined by the periodic investigation and valuation required by said Retirement Law.
- 20. Contributions required of Public Agency and its employees shall be paid by Public Agency to the Retirement System within fifteen days after the end of the period to which said contributions refer or as may be prescribed by Board regulation. If more or less than the correct amount of contributions is paid for any period, proper adjustment shall be made in connection with subsequent remittances. Adjustments on account of errors in contributions required of any employee may be made by direct payments between the employee and the Board.

Subject: Discussion and Direction Regarding the San Fernando Open Streets Festival

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the City Council:

- a. Receive a presentation from staff regarding the status of the San Fernando Open Streets Festival; and
- b. Provide staff direction, as appropriate.

BACKGROUND:

- 1. On March 31, 2018, the City successfully implemented the San Fernando Streets Festival, which was one of Metro's Open Streets Cycle Two events and was attended by thousands of people over 3 miles of San Fernando City streets.
- 2. On June 4, 2018, the City Council authorized preparation and submittal of an application to the Metro Open Streets Grant Program Cycle Three to fund a second San Fernando Streets Festival.
- 3. On September 27, 2018, the Los Angeles Metro Board selected the City of San Fernando as one of the host cities for an Open Streets event. The City was awarded \$144,000 to implement the program.
- 4. On November 21, 2018, staff circulated a Request for Proposal (RFP) to solicit Project Management Services for the Open Streets event. The due date was December 19, 2018. There were no replies to this RFP.
- 5. On January 7, 2019, staff recirculated the RFP targeting vendors specializing in conducting Open Streets and CicLAvia events. Once again, there were no bids for this RFP.

- 6. On April 15, 2019, staff reached out to Utopia Worldwide and met with Valley Care Community Consortium to discuss the Open Streets event and the prospect of assuming the management responsibilities for the event.
- 7. On May 6, 2019, staff updated City Council regarding the status of the Open Streets event. City Council's direction was to move the event date from May 2, 2020, due to potential safety issues with closing down two major thoroughfares during the Cinco de Mayo festivities in neighboring communities. The Open Streets event was rescheduled to October 31, 2020.
- 8. On September 16, 2019, City Council awarded a Professional Service Agreement to Valley Care Community Consortium (VCCC) for \$114,000 to manage and promote the San Fernando Streets Festival-Nocturnal Ride event (Open Streets event). In early October 2019, VCCC and Recreation and Community Services (RCS) staff began planning the Open Streets event.
- 9. On March 16, 2020, the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health issued an order to prohibit group events and gatherings. The order required the postponement or cancelation of non-essential gatherings of 50 or more people to help stop the spread of community transmission of the COVID-19 Coronavirus.
- 10. On March 21, 2020, the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health issued a revised order prohibiting all events and gatherings of any size and ordered all individuals to stay home.
- 11. On May 28, 2020, Metro's Board of Directors approved a motion to change the scope of the Open Streets Program in response to COVID-19. Upon written request from the grantees, host cities may cancel, postpone or repurpose the Open Streets grant funds.

ANALYSIS:

Through the Metro Open Streets Grant Program, the City received a \$144,000 grant to host the San Fernando Open Streets Festival-Nocturnal Ride event. However, due to the Safer at Home Order and widespread call for social distancing in public places, hosting a large-scale Open Streets event is unfeasible at this time and the immediate future of the Open Streets event remains unclear.

The original health order issued on March 16, 2020, was revised several times and eventually become the Safer at Home Order (Order) that prohibited all group events and gatherings of any size. This aspect of the Order currently remains in effect. The Metro Board realized that some Open Streets Grant Program awardees are unable to use their grants as intended, and on May 28, 2020 passed a motion in response to the COVID-19 crisis that changed the scope of the grant program.

The changes allow three options for what the City can do with the Open Streets grant funds. The first option allows grantees to cancel their Open Streets events without penalty. Metro would work closely with the City to identify any funds already expended and reimburse such funds under the original grant agreement. The funds that have been expended between October of 2019 and July 6, 2020, are approximately \$10,965. The City will not be responsible for the local match associated with the expended funds if City Council wishes to cancel the Open Streets event.

The second option allows grantees to reschedule the Open Streets event to a future date. The City must adhere to the original grant award terms and conditions that require a 20% local match. The full grant amount, less any expended funds, can carry over to the new date. The rescheduled event must take place before June 30, 2021, and must be coordinated with Metro to avoid overlapping with other Open Streets events.

The proposed new dates include, but are not limited to:

- Saturday, March 20, 2021
- Saturday, April 3, 2021
- Saturday, May 15, 2021
- Saturday, June 5, 2021
- Saturday, July 3, 2021

The third option allows grantees to repurpose the grant funds towards a Slow Streets event or similar program. A Slow Streets event is a smaller neighborhood-scale event catering to local audiences and is an alternative to the one-day Open Streets event. Rather than a typical four-mile Open Streets route, the Slow Streets event focuses on the temporary closure of two blocks to create a safe space within the public right-of-way to support pedestrian and bicycle traffic, economic activity such as outdoor dining and vending, and the Slow Streets event may occur over a series of dates.

To support such events, the County of Los Angeles Department of Public Health issued a revised Order on May 13, 2020 which allows local public entities to temporarily close streets to through automobile traffic to allow more space for recreational activity in compliance with social distancing requirements.

In addition, the City may also reallocate the grant funds to similar programs such as Safe and Active Streets or First Mile/Last Mile programs that promote safe pedestrian and bicycle traffic. The City currently has proposed improvement projects in both programs that enhance the safety of pedestrians that lack funding. Reallocated funds would need to be spent by June 30, 2021.

The City will need to decide what course of action to take concerning the use of the Open Streets Grant funds. The options are to cancel the event, reschedule to a date no later than June 30, 2021, or repurpose the funds to the Slow Streets event or similar program.

Discussion and Direction Related to the San Fernando Open Streets Festival Page 4 of 4

Upon the City Council's direction, staff will notify Metro of the City's intended use of the Open Streets Grant funds.

BUDGET IMPACT:

The total cost of the San Fernando Streets Festival – Nocturnal Ride program is \$180,000. Metro's grant towards the program is \$144,000 that has been allocated in Fiscal Year 2019-2020. The remaining \$36,000 will be a local City match.

The cancellation of the Open Streets event requires forfeiting \$133,035 in grant funds. The City would request reimbursement of \$10,965 for contractual services already rendered. The full grant award of \$144,000 would apply if the Open Streets event is rescheduled or the City can reallocate \$133,035 to the Slow Streets event or similar program. The local match of 20% applies to a rescheduled event and/or any reallocated funds.

CONCLUSION:

It is recommended that the City Council receive and file this report and provide staff direction, as appropriate.

Funds Provided Through the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act to Establish a Residential Food Distribution Program and Provide Personal Protective Equipment to Eligible Residents and Businesses, and Adopt a Resolution

Appropriating Funds to the Fiscal Year 2020-2021 Annual Budget

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the City Council:

- a. Approve the use of the additional Community Development Block Grant funding provided through the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act to establish a Residential Food Distribution Program and provide personal protective equipment to eligible residents and businesses:
- b. Adopt Resolution No. 8017 (Attachment "A") appropriating \$136,373 in additional funding in the Fiscal Year 2020-2021 Annual Budget; and
- c. Authorize the City Manager to execute all related documents.

BACKGROUND:

- 1. The City participates in the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) through participation in the Los Angeles County Urban CDBG Program administered by the Los Angeles County Development Authority (LACDA).
- 2. On March 27, 2020, President Trump signed into law the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES Act), which includes \$5 billion in additional CDBG funding to prevent, prepare for, and respond to the Coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic.
- 3. On April 7, 2020, LACDA notified the City that an additional amount of \$136,373 in federal CDBG-CARES Act (CDBG-CV) grant funds are now available to the City in response to COVID-19 (Attachment "B").

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- 4. On May 4, 2020, the City Council discussed a number of recommended uses for CDBG-CV funds proposed by staff. City Council directed staff to return at a future City Council meeting with additional options for use of CDBG-CV funds.
- 5. On May 18, 2020, the City Council further discussed recommended uses for CDBG-CV funds, directed staff to focus on using the funds to provide Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) to residents and businesses and food assistance for residents in need, and formed an Ad Hoc Committee (Fajardo, Mendoza) to work with staff to develop the recommended programs and allocations to each program.
- 6. The Ad Hoc Committee met on June 11, 2020 and June 16, 2020.

ANALYSIS:

The CARES Act provides CDBG grantees with the flexibility to make it easier to use CDBG-CARES funds and fiscal years 2019 and 2020 CDBG Grants for coronavirus response. The CARES Act also requires CDBG-CV grantees to prevent the duplication of benefits, which means grant funds may not be used to pay costs if another source of financial assistance is available to pay that cost.

CDBG-CV funds must be used to cover or reimburse costs to prevent, prepare for, and respond to coronavirus when those costs comply with the CDBG requirements. A summary of appropriate uses is included in the *Quick Guide to CDBG Eligible Activities to Support Coronavirus and Other Infectious Disease Response* (Attachment "C").

Based on feedback provided by the City Council on May 18, 2020, the Ad Hoc Committee focused on the following programs:

Vouchers for Residents to Purchase Food.

According to LACDA, a food distribution program in response to COVID-19 through distribution of food items or providing for a meal voucher or store branded value card qualifies as a CDBG general Public Service activity for income eligible households.

Initial discussions with City Council and the Ad Hoc Committee focused on providing meals through local restaurants and/or grocery stores. However, after discussing this with the City's CDBG consultant, this arrangement presents a number of administrative hurdles. First, CDBG is a federal program that has restrictions on what types of items could be purchased through a voucher program. For example, CDBG funds cannot be used for cigarettes, alcohol and other non-food items. The purchase of those items cannot be excluded through a gift card program.

Additionally, the City would need to go through a procurement process with each local vendor that may be providing food through this program to demonstrate the funds are being used for competitively priced goods. This would create an administrative burden on both the City and interested restaurants.

Lastly, the City reached out to a few local grocery stores that indicated, aside from a gift card program that has no controls in place regarding what items are purchased, the administrative burden on the store to create a separate accounting, control system, training for all cashiers, and risk of counterfeit vouchers for which they would not get reimbursed is too significant for them to implement.

The high administrative costs for a food voucher program would erode the amount of funding available to meet the objective, which is to get food into the homes of residents. Therefore, staff does not recommend a food voucher program directly with local restaurants and grocery stores.

In order to meet the goals of the program and minimize the administrative burden, staff recommends the following program:

- Allocate \$100,000 toward a Residential Food Distribution Program.
- City Recreation staff purchase non-perishable food in bulk from local grocery stores to be boxed and provided to each qualifying household.
- A self-certification form that complies with LACDA guidelines is used to certify eligible households. The City's CDBG consultant will manage the self-certification process and submit the required forms to LACDA.
- A box of goods with a value of up to \$250 will be provided to each qualifying household.
 This may include canned meat and vegetables, pasta, sugar and spices, sauces, canned
 soups and stews, coffee and tea, rice, baby food, etc. Personal protective equipment
 including masks, hand sanitizer, and disinfectant solution may also be provided.
- Staff will hold a number of events throughout the summer to distribute the box of goods to pre-qualified families.
- Additional funding may be used to provide a box of goods to qualifying seniors as well.
- This program could provide non-perishable food and PPE to 400 500 households.

Personal Protective Equipment.

According to LACDA, providing equipment, supplies and materials to protect against the spread of COVID-19 qualifies as a CDBG general Public Service activity. City Council discussed using CDBG funding to provide PPE to City staff and local businesses. The City's CDBG consultant followed up with LACDA and determined that City staff may not be eligible to receive PPE through this program. However, eligible local businesses may receive PPE after completing a simple self-certification form.

In order to meet the goals of the program and support local businesses, staff recommends the following program:

- Allocate \$25,000 toward PPE for businesses located in San Fernando, with an emphasis on customer facing businesses, such as retail, food service, personal care services, etc.
- City staff purchase touchless hand sanitizer dispensers (with sanitizer refills), plastic face shields, plastic gloves, and disposable masks to be provided to each qualifying business.
 The City will also purchase and provide posters and signs notifying customers of the required social distancing protocol as well as floor decals to direct patrons where to stand while inside a business.
- A self-certification form that complies with LACDA guidelines is used to certify eligible businesses. The City's CDBG consultant will manage the self-certification process and submit the required forms to LACDA.
- A box of supplies with a value of up to \$125 will be provided to each qualifying business.
- This program could provide PPE to approximately 200 businesses.

Administrative Expenses.

In addition to the recommended funding allocation for each program above, it is recommended that \$11,373 is allocated for administrative expenses necessary to manage each program, including, but not limited to, reviewing and submitting the self-certification forms to LACDA, preparing and submitting reimbursement requests to items purchased through this program, staff time related to procuring and distributing goods, and costs related to closeout and audit of the programs once completed.

BUDGET IMPACT:

The City's allocation of CDBG-CARES Act funds through LACDA is \$136,373, which can be used to support the City's COVID-19 response and planning effort in accordance with CDBG guidelines for use of funds. It is recommended that the funds are allocated as follows:

- 1. \$100,000 toward a Residential Food Distribution Program.
- 2. \$25,000 toward a Business PPE Distribution Program.
- 3. \$11,373 toward administration costs.

Approval of Resolution No. 8017 will appropriate CDBG-CV funds in the Fiscal Year 2020-2021 Annual Budget and allow staff to implement the proposed programs.

CONCLUSION:

It is recommended that the City Council authorize the use of CDBG-CARES Act funding toward the programs identified by the Ad Hoc Committee and approve a resolution appropriating the funds in the Fiscal Year 2020-2021 Annual Budget.



This bulletin provides information to Los Angeles Urban County CDBG participating cities on additional funding, revisions to various program provisions, and shares ideas on adjustments cities and service providers are making to provide a rapid response to the critical needs of residents and businesses impacted by COVID-19.

On March 27, 2020, President Trump signed into law the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES Act), which includes \$5 billion in additional CDBG funding to prevent, prepare for, and respond to the COVID-19 pandemic. The following is a breakdown of the funding and how HUD plans to allocate it nationwide:

- \$2 billion as a direct allocation to state and local governments through the existing formula for all grantees that received a Fiscal Year (FY) 2020-2021 CDBG allocation. The Los Angeles Urban County has been allocated \$13,668,315.
 - The Los Angeles Urban County Participating City CDBG-CARES Act supplemental allocations are included on page 4 of this bulletin. They are based on the current CDBG allocation methodology and are expected to be available by late April.
- \$2 billion allocated directly to state and local governments, at the discretion of the Secretary of the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), using a new formula to be developed by HUD including prioritizing risk of transmission of coronavirus, number of coronavirus cases compared to the national average, and economic and housing market disruptions. HUD has not yet determined the amount the Los Angeles Urban County will receive under this allocation method.
- \$1 billion to States based on a new formula developed by HUD including taking into account public health needs, risk of transmission of coronavirus, number of coronavirus cases compared to the national average, and economic and housing market interruptions. States may implement activities within both entitlement areas and in non-entitlement areas that do not receive a direct allocation from HUD or participate in an Urban County program. It is currently unknown how much the Los Angeles Urban County may receive directly or indirectly from the State of California.

Revisions to Program Provisions

The CARES Act identifies program provisions that allow revisions to the following CDBG administrative requirements. These provisions apply to current and new FY 2019-2020 and FY 2020-2021 CDBG-funded activities and new CDBG-CARES Act-funded activities to prevent, prepare for, and respond to the COVID-19 pandemic:

- Suspends the 15% cap on public services;
- Allows virtual hearings as long as national or local health authorities recommend social distancing and limit public gatherings for public health reasons; and
- Allows the public comment period for substantial amendments and for the FY 2020-2021 Action Plan to be reduced from 30 days to five (5) days.

Responding to Community Needs

As our cities and other partner agencies have taken precautionary measures to keep their employees and clients safe, many programs are adapting operations to remain focused on the continuity of essential services. The majority of our cities and agencies are complying with the "safer at home" directive by allowing personnel to work remotely and begin to implement alternative methods of service delivery. With your input, an assessment of the operational status of your agencies has identified what programs have proceeded, been modified, or suspended. It has revealed many examples of how agencies have remained proactive in assessing community needs and remaining operational through virtual services and other modifications that adapt congregate activities to virtual services and other changes to program delivery.

On March 18, 2020, through CDBG-EDL message "HUD Publishes CDBG Quick Guide to Support Infectious Disease Response - COVID19", we provided information on COVID19-CDBG eligible activities. The following shares ideas on what has been learned about some preliminary local efforts and adjustments you might consider to continue providing valuable services in your community:

Other eligible activities jurisdictions may consider are short-term subsistence payments for up to three (3) months of assistance on behalf of an individual or family for rent or utilities and assisting small and micro businesses through loans and grants.

Repurposing and Adding CDBG-Funded Programs

If your agency anticipates having unspent funds due to the suspension of currently funded activities or has available unprogrammed funds, you may amend projects to increase the budgets of other current CDBG-funded programs that are in greater need. As authorized in the CARES Act, participating cities may exceed the 15% public service cap by allocating additional funds to COVID-19-related public service programs. Unless it is a local requirement, no public notice or Council approval is required.

To allocate additional funds to existing CDBG-funded activities that can respond to COVID-19, please send an email request with amendment details to your Contract Manager and they will process the amendment for you. Approved modifications to existing activities may begin immediately and do not have to wait for the amendment to be executed. **The deadline for amendments to existing CDBG-funded activities is May 1, 2020.**

To add a new project or cancel an existing CDBG-funded activity, the CARES Act has reduced the public notice period from 30 days to 5 days. The Los Angeles Urban County Consolidated Plan Citizen Participation Plan is being revised to not require City Council approval for new projects. Unless it is a local requirement, this will not be required for new CDBG-funded activities implemented under the CARES Act.

Further guidance on the process to add new activities utilizing CDBG-CARES Act Supplemental Funding is forthcoming. We will also provide any additional information regarding additional funds and other program requirements and opportunities as soon as it is received.

Thank you for your ongoing partnership. We look forward to working with you in putting CDBG dollars into action to help our residents and communities affected by the COVID-19 pandemic.

Quick Guide to CDBG Eligible Activities to Support Coronavirus and Other Infectious Disease Response REVISED April 6, 2020

Grantees should coordinate with local health authorities before undertaking any activity to support state or local pandemic response. Grantees may use Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds for a range of eligible activities that prevent and respond to the spread of infectious diseases such as the coronavirus.

Planning Considerations

Infectious disease response conditions rapidly evolve and may require changes to the planned use of funds:

- CDBG grantees must amend their Consolidated Annual Action Plan (Con Plan) when there is a change to the allocation priorities or method of distribution of funds; an addition of an activity not described in the plan; or a change to the purpose, scope, location, or beneficiaries of an activity (24 CFR 91.505).
- If the changes meet the criteria for a "substantial amendment" in the grantee's citizen participation plan, the grantee must follow its citizen participation process for amendments (24 CFR 91.105 and 91.115).
- Under the CARES Act, CDBG grantees may amend citizen participation and Con Plans concurrently in order to establish and implement expedited procedures with a comment period of no less than 5-days.

I have submitted this item to discuss the City's whistleblower and alleged employee misconduct procedures and provide direction to staff, as appropriate.

ANALYSIS:

Staff Update:

In addition to the Whistleblower Procedures included as Attachment "A," which are primarily related to unsafe employment practices and/or unsafe conditions, employees may report possible employee misconduct to their supervisor, Department Head, City Manager or the City Attorney. In order to be considered for follow-up, claims of alleged employee misconduct should be accompanied by evidence of the alleged misconduct. The City does not currently have its own Whistleblower Policy related to reporting of alleged misconduct.

BUDGET IMPACT:

There is no impact to the budget by discussing this item. Additional future costs to be determined based on City Council direction.

Filing Whistleblower Complaints under Section 11(c) of the OSH Act of 1970

Employees are protected from retaliation for raising workplace health and safety concerns and for reporting work-related injuries and illnesses.

Covered Employees

Section 11(c) of the *Occupational Safety* and *Health Act of 1970* (OSH Act) prohibits employers from retaliating against employees for exercising a variety of rights guaranteed under the OSH Act, such as filing a safety or health complaint with OSHA, raising a health and safety concern with their employers, participating in an OSHA inspection, or reporting a work-related injury or illness.

A covered employee is any employee of a person engaged in a business affecting interstate commerce, except employees of the United States, States, or political subdivisions of States.¹ However, employees of the United States Postal Service are also covered employees.

Protected Activity

A person may not discharge or in any manner retaliate against an employee because the employee:

Filed any complaint or instituted or caused to be instituted any proceeding under or related to the OSH Act.

Exercised any right afforded by the OSH Act. Examples include, but are not limited to:

 communicating orally or in writing with management personnel about occupational safety or health matters, including asking questions or expressing concerns, requesting safety data sheets, reporting a work-related injury or illness, or requesting copies of OSHA standards or regulations;

- filing a safety/health complaint with OSHA;
- or participating in an OSHA on-site inspection.

Unfavorable Employment Actions

A person taking an unfavorable employment action against an employee may be found to have violated Section 11(c) of the OSH Act if the employee would not have experienced the unfavorable employment action(s) but for their protected activity. Unfavorable employment actions may include:

- · Firing or laying off
- Blacklisting
- Demoting
- · Denying overtime or promotion
- Disciplining
- Denying benefits
- Failure to hire or rehire
- Intimidation
- · Making threats
- Reassignment affecting prospects for promotion
- Reducing pay or hours

Deadline for Filing Complaints

Complaints must be filed within 30 days after the alleged unfavorable employment action occurs (that is, when the employee is notified of the retaliatory action).

Employees filing untimely retaliation complaints with OSHA may be referred to the National Labor Relations Board (NLRB) for possible further action.

How to File an 11(c) Complaint

An employee, or representative of an employee, who believes he or she has been retaliated against in violation of Section 11(c), may file a complaint with OSHA within 30 days of the unfavorable employment action (see above). Complaints may be filed verbally with OSHA

^{1.} Federal employees are protected from retaliation for occupational safety or health activity under procedures established by their agencies pursuant to Executive Order 12196. See 29 CFR 1960.46-47. They are also protected from retaliation for whistleblowing under the Whistleblower Protection Act. For more information visit www.osc.gov.

by visiting or calling the local OSHA office at 1-800-321-OSHA (6742), or may be filed in writing by sending a written complaint to the closest OSHA regional or area office, or by filing a complaint online at www.whistleblowers.gov/complaint_page.html.

Written complaints may be filed by facsimile, electronic communication, hand delivery during normal business hours, U.S. mail (confirmation services recommended), or other third-party commercial carrier.

The date of the postmark, facsimile, electronic communication, telephone call, hand delivery, delivery to a third-party commercial carrier, or in-person filing at an OSHA office is considered the date filed. No particular form is required and complaints may be submitted in any language.

To file a complaint electronically, please visit: www.whistleblowers.gov/complaint_page.html.

To contact OSHA to file a complaint, please call 1-800-321-OSHA (6742) and they will connect you to the closest office; or visit www.osha.gov/html/RAmap.html.

Upon receipt, OSHA will review the complaint to determine whether it is appropriate to conduct

a fact-finding investigation (e.g., whether the complaint was filed within 30 days; whether the allegation is covered by Section 11(c)). All complaints are investigated according to requirements in 29 CFR Part 1977.

In the 22 states with OSHA-approved state plans which cover the private sector, employees may file a complaint under Section 11(c) of the OSH Act or a complaint under the State's analogous whistleblower provision or both. The complaint with Federal OSHA must be filed within 30 days of the unfavorable employment action. The complaint filed with the State agency must be filed within the time limit prescribed by State law. State and local government employees in these States, and in six States with plans covering only State and local government employees, may only file occupational safety or health retaliation claims with the State agencies. For a list of state plans, please visit: www.osha.gov/dcsp/osp.

What to do about a Dangerous Situation at Work

If workers believe working conditions are unsafe or unhealthful, it is recommended that they bring the conditions to their employer's attention, if possible, and before they are faced with either refusing to perform a task or exposing themselves to a serious hazard.

Workers may file a complaint with OSHA concerning a hazardous working condition at any time. For information on occupational safety and health laws, standards, and regulations, visit OSHA's website: www.osha.gov.

Not all work refusals due to unsafe or unhealthful conditions are protected by section 11(c). A worker would be protected from subsequent retaliation when the worker has a reasonable apprehension of death or serious injury; and refuses in good faith to perform the task; and has no alternative assignment; and there is insufficient time to have Federal or State OSHA conduct an inspection or where such an inspection has already taken place; and where possible the employee has sought from the employer but was unable to obtain correction of the dangerous condition. For more information: www.osha.gov/workers.

Results of the Investigation

If the evidence supports an employee's claim of retaliation and a voluntary settlement cannot be reached, the Secretary of Labor, through the Office of the Solicitor of Labor (SOL), may litigate the case in U.S. District Court. The Secretary may seek relief to make the employee whole, including:

- · Reinstatement.
- Payment of back pay with interest.
- Compensation for expenses the employee may have incurred, as a result of the retaliation with interest; and for emotional distress.
- · Punitive damages.
- Non-monetary relief.

If the OSHA Regional Administrator whose office investigated the case finds that the evidence does not support an employee's claim of retaliation, the employee may seek review by the Directorate of Whistleblower Protection

Programs (DWPP) in Washington, D.C. by filing a request for such review, within 15 days of the employee's receipt of the dismissal letter, with a copy to the Regional Administrator.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the City Council:

a. Take no action and table this discussion to a date uncertain.

OR

b. Introduce for first reading by title only, and waive further reading of Ordinance No. 1698 "Ordinance of the City Council of the City of San Fernando moving the date of the General Municipal Elections from the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November of even-numbered years to the first Tuesday after the first Monday in March of even-numbered years beginning with the General Municipal Election of March 5, 2024."

BACKGROUND:

- 1. On September 1, 2015, Governor Jerry Brown signed Senate Bill 415 (SB 415) into law which prohibits a local government from holding an election on any date other than a statewide election date, if doing so in the past has resulted in turnout that is at least 25% below the average turnout in that jurisdiction in the last four statewide general elections. Section 14052(b) of the Elections Code allows the City to hold elections on dates other than statewide election dates, after January 1, 2018, if it adopts a plan to consolidate a future election with a statewide election before the November 8, 2022 statewide general election.
- 2. On July 18, 2016, the City adopted Resolution No. 7754, which set forth the City's intention and plan to begin holding its elections on the first Tuesday after the First Monday in November no later than November 8, 2022; and on July 17, 2017, the City Council conducted a public hearing and directed staff to accelerate the switch to statewide election dates. On the meeting of August 21, 2017, Ordinance No. 1668 was adopted to change its municipal election to the statewide general election beginning on November 6, 2018.

ORDINANCE NO. 1698

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN FERNANDO MOVING THE DATE OF GENERAL MUNICIPAL ELECTIONS FROM THE FIRST TUESDAY AFTER THE FIRST MONDAY IN NOVEMBER OF EVENNUMBERED YEARS TO THE FIRST TUESDAY AFTER THE FIRST MONDAY IN MARCH OF EVEN-NUMBERED YEARS BEGINNING WITH THE GENERAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION OF MARCH 5, 2024

WHEREAS, general law cities, such as the City of San Fernando (the "City"), are obligated to conduct general and special municipal elections in accordance with the California Elections Code (the "Elections Code"), per Elections Code Section 10101, et seq.;

WHEREAS, commencing January 1, 2018, Senate Bill 415 prohibited San Fernando and many other cities from holding an election on any date other than a statewide election date, as doing so in the past in turnout that was at least twenty-five percent (25%) below the average turnout in that jurisdiction in the last four statewide general elections;

WHEREAS, on August 21, 2017, the City adopted Resolution No. 1668, which set forth the City's intention and plan to begin holding its elections on the first Tuesday after the First Monday in November no later than November 8, 2022; and

WHEREAS, the City ultimately commenced holding its General Municipal Elections on the first Tuesday after the First Monday in November beginning with the General Municipal Election held November 6, 2018; and

WHEREAS, on September 27, 2017, the Governor signed Senate Bill (SB) 568 which beginning in the year 2019 moved the statewide direct primary election held on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in June in even-numbered years to the first Tuesday after the first Monday in March of even-numbered years; and

WHEREAS, the City Council wishes to avail itself of the ability to hold its General Municipal Elections on the first Tuesday following the first Monday in March of even-numbered years as now permitted by way of SB 568.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN FERNANDO, CALIFORNIA DOES HEREBY ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The facts set forth in the recitals above are true and correct and incorporated herein by reference.

SECTION 2. General Municipal Elections for the City of San Fernando a hereby moved from the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November of even-numbered years to the first Tuesday after the First Monday in March of even-numbered years, commencing with the General

Election Municipal Election to be held March 5, 2018. In recognition of the foregoing, Section 2.91 (Date of General Municipal Elections; Consolidation with County) of Division 3 of Chapter 2 (Administration) of the San Fernando Municipal Code, is hereby amended in its entirety to now state the following,

Division 3. - General Municipal Elections.

2.91 Date of General Municipal Elections; Consolidation with County.

- (a) (i) The city shall hold its general municipal elections on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November of each even-numbered years. This subsection 2.91(a)(i) shall remain in effect until January 1, 2023 and as of that date is repealed.
 - (ii) The city shall hold its general municipal elections on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in March of even-numbers years, with the first such election to be held March 5, 2024. This subjection 2.91(a)(ii) shall become operative on January 1, 2023.
- (b) General municipal elections held pursuant to this Section shall be consolidated with the concurrent statewide election of the same date administered by the Registrar-Recorder for the County of Los Angeles unless the County Board of Supervisors denies such consolidation pursuant to Elections Code section 10402.5.

SECTION 3. In order to accommodate the new election schedule, the terms for City elected officials who were victorious at elections in November of 2020 and 2022 shall be subject to a reduction of approximately four months from terms of office as follows:

SECTION 4. In accordance with Elections Code Section 10403.5(b), this Ordinance shall cause no elected city terms of office to be increased or decreased by more than twelve (12) months.

<u>SECTION 5.</u> <u>Inconsistent Provisions</u>. Any provision of the San Fernando City Code or appendices thereto that conflicts with the provisions of this Ordinance, to the extent of such conflict and no further, is hereby repealed or modified to the extent necessary to affect the provisions of

this Ordinance.

SECTION 6. Severability. If any section, subsection, subdivision, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance, or any part thereof is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a decision of any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance or any part thereof. The City Council hereby declares that it would have passed each section, subsection, subdivision, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase thereof, irrespective of the fact that any one or more section, subsection, subdivision, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase would be subsequently declared invalid or unconstitutional.

SECTION 7. Publication. The Mayor shall sign and the City Clerk shall attest to the passage of this Ordinance. The City Clerk shall cause the same to be published once in the official newspaper within fifteen (15) days after its adoption.

SECTION 8. Effective Date/Operative Date. The Mayor shall sign and the City Clerk shall attest to the passage of this Ordinance. The City Clerk shall cause the same to be published once in a newspaper of general circulation within fifteen (15) days after its adoption. This Ordinance shall become effective thirty (30) days after a second reading and adoption. This Ordinance shall become operative upon, and subject to, any approval required by the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors, per Elections Code Section 1301(b).

SECTION 9. The City Clerk is directed to forward without delay to the County of Los Angeles Board of Supervisors and to the County of Los Angeles Registrar/Recorder/ County Clerk, each a certified copy of this Ordinance.
