BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS:

The Annual Student Scholarship Program was established to assist San Fernando youth who are seeking a postsecondary education.

The scholarship program has grown from two scholarships to eight scholarships awarded annually. Scholarships are funded through donations from various donor sources, including, but not limited to current/former Councilmembers, organizations such as Independent Cities Finance Authority (ICFA), and Republic Services.

At the August meeting the Commission set an amount for each of the Student Scholarships that will be awarded in 2022-2023. They also reviewed the existing scholarship accounts and recommended all accounts be consolidated into one account.

BUDGET IMPACT:

There is no fiscal impact with the discussion of this item. Future expenditures are to be determined based on the Education Commissions' direction.
