5) Discussion Regarding the City's MOU with LAUSD

Mayor Celeste Rodriguez updated the Commission on the low literacy scores of local schools and discussed the 11 items listed on the City's MOU with LAUSD. Mayor Rodriguez also commented on the challenges at a local high school with gang violence. She added that City of San Fernando Police Chief Fabian Valdez, is currently trying to provide additional support to students and staff at the local high school. Commissioners shared thoughts and recommendations with Mayor Rodriguez. Commissioners would like to see more school crossing guards and a map of the free mini libraries within the City of San Fernando.

Chair Govea met with Superintendent for Local District Northwest, Dr. David Baca, to discuss the MOU and safety issues. Commissioners are invited to join Chair Govea at his next meeting with Dr. Baca. Commissioner Robledo also offered to bring the topic of safe and positive school climate to the commission of human relations.

Commissioner Mohr commented on the low literacy scores of City schools and commented on the importance of putting books in students' hands. She also suggested SFPD open up internships within City schools. Commissioner Mohr stressed the importance of the City of San Fernando promoting E-Choices on its website.

## **BACKGROUND:**

- 1. The Teacher's Spotlight was a program developed by the Commission to recognize inspirational teachers working in San Fernando schools. In July 2020, the first Teacher Spotlight recipient was nominated and awarded during a City Council meeting in September 2020.
- 2. In November 2022 the Education Commission discussed bringing back the Teacher's Spotlight Program. It was decided to table the item and discuss at a later date.

## **BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS:**

The Education Commission reinstated the Principal's Brunch in July 2022. In September 2022, the Education Commission voted to host the brunch on Friday, January 27, 2023. The event was very successful and many local school administrators attended. Departing guests were asked to fill out a program evaluation, and provide their thoughts regarding the event. Based on the popularity of the Principal's Brunch and the comments provided on the evaluation the Commission has decided to discuss the creation of a second event during the school year. A high number of comments suggested that networking events like the Principles brunch should be offered more than once a year.

In September the Commission decided to host the Principals' Showcase during the October 24<sup>th</sup> Special Commission meeting. The month of October was selected because it is school choice season (LAUSD's eChoices application opens October 2nd and closes November 17th). Local school principals/administrators were invited to give a brief presentation about the exciting things happening at each school.
